## NOTICE OF WORKSHOP TO SOLICIT COMMENTS ON PROPOSED REGULATIONS OF THE NEVADA BOARD OF INDIGENT DEFENSE SERVICES

The purpose of the workshop is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the potential adoption of regulations that pertain to Chapter 180 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

The purpose of the proposed regulations is to regulate Indigent Defense Services. The following general topics may be addressed in the proposed regulations, including, but not limited to:

- Establishing minimum standards for the delivery of indigent defense services;
- Establishing requirements for specific continuing education and experience for attorneys who provide indigent defense services;
- Requiring attorneys who provide indigent defense services to track their time and
  provide reports, and requiring the State Public Defender and counties that employ
  attorneys or otherwise contract for the provision of indigent defense services to
  require or include a provision in the employment or other contract requiring
  compliance with the regulations;
- Establishing standards to ensure that attorneys who provide indigent defense services track and report information in a uniform manner;
- Establishing guidelines to be used to determine the maximum caseloads for attorneys who provide indigent defense services;
- Requiring the Department of Indigent Defense Services and each county that
  employs or contracts for the provision of indigent defense services to ensure, to the
  greatest extent possible, consistency in the representation of indigent defendants
  so that the same attorney represents a defendant through every stage of the case
  without delegating the representation to others, except that administrative and
  other tasks which do not affect the rights of the defendant may be delegated.
- Establishing recommendations for the manner in which an attorney who is appointed to provide indigent defense services may request and receive reimbursement for expenses related to trial, including, without limitation, expenses for expert witnesses and investigators;
- Establishing a formula for determining the maximum amount that a county may be required to pay for the provision of indigent defense services.
