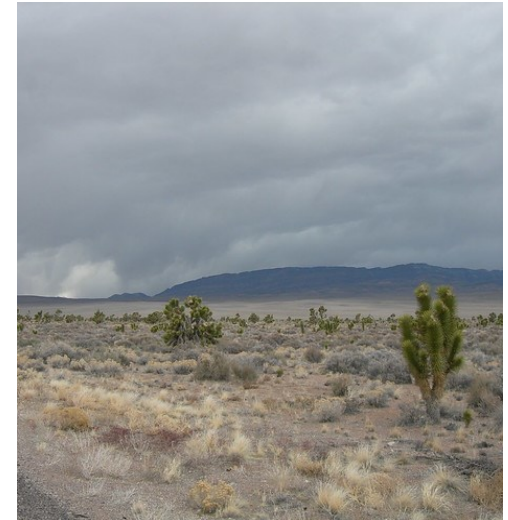

Rural Clinics

Rural Clinics is a state agency within the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public and Behavioral Health. Rural Clinics is open Monday through Friday from 8:00AM to 5:00PM, not including State holidays.

There are 16 clinics in 12 counties which provide an array of behavioral health services for adults and children to assist individuals to achieve self-sufficiency and recovery.

Services include: Case Management, Rehabilitative Mental Health, Mental Health Therapy, Medication Management Clinic, Residential Support, Psychological Testing, and Crisis Stabilization Teams. Rural Clinics also has a Mental Health Court program in Carson City and, in some counties, works with local law enforcement to support their Mobile Outreach Safety Team (MOST).

Rural Clinics services are individualized, culturally appropriate, community-based and meet high standards of care. Agency personnel collaborate with public and private partners to ensure continuity of care.

Description of Services

Rehabilitative Mental Health (RMH)

– Assists individuals to develop, enhance and/or retain skills, personal adjustment and/or independent living competencies in order to function as independently as possible.

Mental Health Therapy – Therapeutic interventions provided to individuals and families which are individualized for a presenting need. Families are always involved in treatment for children and adolescents.

Medication Management Clinic –

Assist individuals in recognizing the benefits and risks of medication in managing their mental illness. Services include education with the individual about medication benefits and side effects, treatment and referrals to other services, communication with the primary care physician, to ensure effective treatment of mental health through medication management.

Residential Support – Provides rental assistance and other necessary supports to maintain stable housing (federal and state funding). All residential supports are based on individual need and are coordinated with Nevada Rural Housing Authority.

Case Management – Assists individuals, including those in Mental Health Court, to gain access to needed medical, social, educational and other supports, including housing and transportation needs.

Psychological Testing — Provide psychological testing including psychological diagnostic assessment of intellectual functioning, executive functioning, personality, psychopathology, assistance to clinicians with diagnostic clarification.

Crisis Stabilization Teams – Rural Clinics provides Crisis Response and Stabilization services to reduce emergency department visits by providing immediate support, crisis interventions, short-term stabilization, case management services and assistance with hospitalization if needed. Interventions are provided in the community in which the person lives via phone or video as follows:

- ◆ **Youth—Rural Mobile Crisis Response Team:** Supports youth (ages up to 18) and families in a behavioral health crisis by stabilizing the crisis and helping find community resources.
